

Pulpitch: “A Thanksgiving Assignment”

November 2008

I know one of the reasons God doesn't seem to work in your life. I know why some of your prayers bounce. Do you want to know why? Listen to these words: **1 Thess 5:18 “Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.”** God does not work in a thankless heart. There are some circumstances for which you are not operating in thanksgiving; some situations for which you have not praised God. Bev points out these things to me ... and others with annoying regularity. God can only work in certain environments – praise and thanksgiving create an environment which invites God's work. This month, let's set the climate of our hearts to be a place that invites God.

Not only do we find it difficult to thank God for unpleasant circumstance, sometimes we have not properly thanked him for what He has done. Consider the 10 lepers that He healed. Nine took the gift without thanking the giver, but watch what one did: **Luke 17:16 He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him ... 17 Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine?"** You may be one of the nine. This is the month to change the environment.

So the first assignment is to give thanks in ALL circumstances. Survey your life. Is there an area of omission anywhere? By Nov. 27, may the dressing of Thanksgiving be a grateful heart ... and see what God does. It might be that the answers we seek lie in a thankful heart to God.

There is a second assignment: there is some person in your family, in your work, in your neighborhood who needs to hear words of thanks by Nov. 27. Maybe you've said thanks before, but you need to put it in writing and be specific for the reasons of your thanksgiving. As soon as you read this, ask God who the person is that you need to target for thanksgiving. There may be more than one. Next, sit down and write a note of thanksgiving. God will inspire you how to word it. I promise that your words will be like fresh water on dry land.

Speaking of a thankful heart, to everyone reading these words, I say thank you for being part of my life. Paul wrote: **2 Thess 1:3 We ought always to thank God for you, brothers...** Your love, your service, your generosity, your selfless quality of life continually humbles and inspires me.

There is a grave danger in not giving thanks. **Rom 1:21 For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened. 22 Although they claimed to be wise, they became fools**” To not give thanks turns the light off in our hearts and leaves us fools - whoops, there is that word again – fools (morons = those who have the right information but do not use it.) Wise living is thanksgiving – to God and others.

Reflections of our Russia Trip

From September 9 – 19, 2008, six of us from our church traveled to Russia for the purpose of bringing Christ's love and presence to the Russian people in a variety of settings. The settings included schools, orphanages, a home for the elderly, churches, a hospital, city administration offices and private residences. The six of us who went were Pastor Wes, Dave Przekwas, Doug and Marcia Purcey and Jay and Debbie Johnson. While this was Wes' fourteenth trip, and Jay's third and Dave's second, it was the first time in Russia for Doug, Marcia and Debbie.

After initially arriving in Moscow, the team traveled south to Voronezh. From there, the team began their ministry opportunities by traveling to the area of Ramon as well as to the Tambov oblast (state). The trip was an incredible experience, one none of us will ever forget. When we returned, we reflected on the trip and gave thought to the following three questions and wanted to share our answers with you.

The questions we asked ourselves were: "what did the trip mean to you, why are you glad you went and what are the things you will always remember?"

Pastor Wes – "The trip was an opportunity to minister among those who did not yet know Christ. Usually I work with Christians. This trip was unique in that way. It was also an opportunity to work with a team and see how God worked in and through the other five. I'm glad I went because of the unbelievable encouragement we brought to the church of the region as well as seeing God work profoundly in the lives of so many; the aroma of Christ. I'll always remember the Tamoyan family with Kharen asking me, "now how do you become a real Christian?" And of course, I'll remember little Maxim, Natasha and Genia (children Wes met at the various places we visited)."

Doug Purcey – "The trip was very humbling to see how many people that have a lot less than we do really put their entire faith in God. It was like going back 50 years to my childhood and how important true family values are to all. I'm glad I went because the trip brought me closer spiritually with Jesus. It let me know just how much we are really not in control of everything in our lives. God is everywhere and was there with us in every step that we took. I'll always remember the love of our new Christian friends from Russia. It was like we had known them all for many years. Their unselfish and relentless love toward each of us was never ending. I look forward to seeing them all again some day in Heaven. Thank you Jesus."

Marcia Purcey – "I'm glad I went because the trip gave me a deeper sense of God. I was able to see how people handled diversities in many different ways. I sometimes think we have too much and it comes too easily. I will always remember Sergey, the young man I met at the same school where we all met Maxim. He spoke so eloquently for his young age and he really touched my heart. I was also amazed on how the people we met were so anxious to see us. After each visit, there was this mutual respect we felt for each other. This was the first time I had ever been on a missions trip as I am a relatively new Christian. I sometimes felt I wasn't able to minister but was blessed to be part of a ministering team. The trip made me feel more a part of our church. It also made me less afraid to share Christ."

Dave Przekwas – "One of the lessons I learned was how important it was to rely on God and let Him work through me. When we only had 30 to 60 minutes to prepare a program, God delivered a program we could not have prepared a month in advance. This made me think of how often I tend to be self-reliant and not seek God. I felt when I submitted to God and let Him work through me I was more effective and more comfortable. The relationships I built with other team members and the Russian families are priceless. I have come closer to Christ through these relationships. I am so glad I had this opportunity to serve the Lord, and I pray that I am as much of an encouragement to others as everyone was to me. One of the events I will always remember was visiting sixteen year old Natasha in the cancer unit at the children's hospital. She had recently accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior. Her compassion for the other children in the hospital and her sisters was over whelming. She was more concerned for their needs than her own. I had an opportunity to witness to Natasha's roommate, Genia, and gave him a wordless bracelet and poem. I asked him if he would mind if I prayed for him and he agreed. Genia's father was not in the room while I prayed for him. I truly believe if the father had not left the room earlier we would not have had the opportunity to witness to Genia. This was truly God's work. I pray God will work through Natasha to share the gift of salvation with him."

Jay Johnson – “We set out to bring Christ-like compassion to the home church groups, orphanages and to the elderly in the towns of two new pastors, expecting God to use us somehow to do His work. With the city leaders, schools and the elderly, we saw transformation with those we met right before our eyes. God’s presence and the support of prayers were seen every where we went. I’m glad I went because I was encouraged to see God at work in the lives of so many people, including us. We were depending on God to lead us through any program we encountered and He always helped us with meeting the right people, bringing the right gifts and bringing the right message. I’ll always remember the way God worked through Wes giving him quick ideas for programs. We saw many people who were dependent on God for provision of money and food. We also had to depend on God for guiding us through each place we went. I remember feeling like a participant in a survivor series. Before each event we were told what the place and audience would be, and we then had to be ready to have a program and to bring effective witness to those people. I also give thanks we were protected during the many driving hours in some very old cars.”

Debbie Johnson – “this trip was the most fulfilling experience I had ever had in my life. As previously mentioned, this was Jay’s third trip. And when he had returned home from his other two trips, I saw a changed man. I saw someone who had a deeper relationship with God each time he returned and I wanted to go and see if I would feel this same way. I can now say that as a result of the trip, I truly feel closer to God than I ever have previously in my life. I’m so glad I went because I was able to see God’s work firsthand. There were so many people we met who put their total trust in God to sustain them and to provide all of their needs. What faith they had! I will always remember the kindness shown to us by everyone we met. No matter where we went, we were made to feel welcomed. I’ll also remember the five translators and how much they gave of themselves in both time and energy to allow us to communicate effectively with all the wonderful people we met. I feel as if I made some wonderful friends while I was there and certainly pray there is an opportunity again for me to travel to this area of the world.”

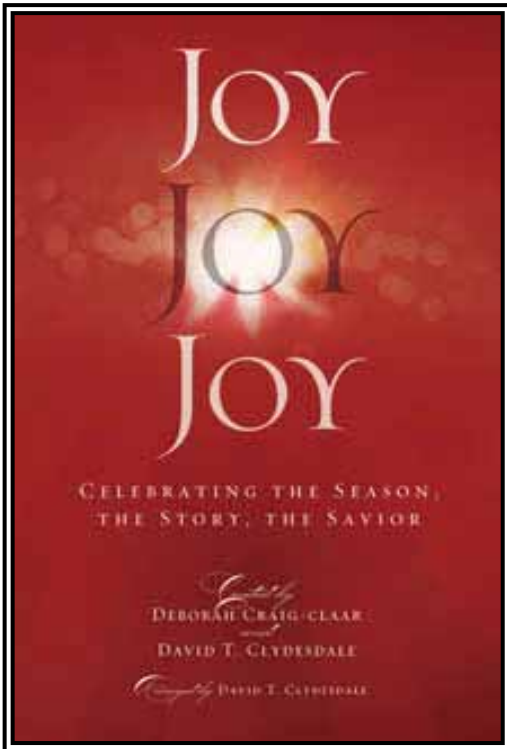
